

ROCHFORD HUNDRED GOLF CLUB



Set amongst the ancient woodlands and farmland of South East Essex, the course cuts its way through the winding streams and creeks of The River Roach & completely surrounds the 13th century parish church of St Andrew.

Boasting one of the World's oldest Grade I listed clubhouses, the original building dates back to 1483, and was once the family home of Anne Boleyn (Queen of England 1533 to 1536).

In 1924 the 100-acre course was re-designed by James Braid, the famous designer of Carnoustie, Royal Troon, & Gleneagles, and still today the course retains many of the typical James Braid features.

Substantial and ongoing investment into the course over many years ensures a genuine traditional parkland feel, with manicured greens and approaches, proving an excellent challenge to all standards of golfer with a warm welcome awaiting you in the clubhouse.

Visiting guests & golf societies are assured of a most memorable day of golf, hospitality and catering to the highest standard.

Our competitive golf schedule is almost unparalleled, with a host of trophies open to our Members; and we take equal pride in the many representative honours bestowed upon our golfers by the Essex Golf Union.
